OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Feast: May 13

Also called as "Our Lady of the Holy Rosary".

It was on this day that apparition of Our Lady of Fatima started to the three shepherd children, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta in the small village of Fatima in Portugal in 1917.



OUR LADY OF MIRACULOUS MEDAL

Feast: November 27

The Miraculous Medal, is a symbol of devotion and faith, of the endless grace the Virgin Mary to her children.

A sign of hope and love.



OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

Feast: June 27

Also known as Our Lady of Perpetual Succour.

The title "Perpetual Help" is one of the better known titles of the Mother of God, especially among the most needy and afflicted who feel the need for love and protection.



OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

Feast: July 16

It was first instituted in the late 14th century in commemoration of the approval of the rule of the Carmelite Order a hundred years earlier.

The scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular, is one of the most significant and celebrated of Roman Catholic devotions.



OUR LADY OF MANAOG

Feast: Third Wednesday of Easter

Formal title, "Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary of Manaoag". The image is currently enshrined at the Minor Basilica in Manaoag, Pangasinan



OUR LADY OF PEACE & GOOD VOYAGE

Feast: First Tuesday of May

Also known as "Our Lady of Antipolo" and "Nuestra Señora de la Paz y Buen Viaje" in Spanish. The image is a Black Madonna, that represents the Immaculate Conception. It is currently enshrined in Antipolo Cathedral, Antipolo City.



OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Feast: September 15

The title, Our Lady of Sorrows, given to our Blessed Mother focuses on her intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of our Lord.

"Therefore, as we honor our Blessed Mother, our Lady of Sorrows, we honor her as the faithful disciple and exemplar of faith". (Saunders, 2000).



OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Feast: December 12

Our Lady of Guadalupe also called in Spanish, Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. The name also refers to the Marian apparition itself.

"She appeared to Juan Diego in a vision in 1531. Our Lady of Guadalupe holds a special place in the religious life of Mexico and is one of the most popular religious devotions and have an important role as a national symbol of Mexico". (Encyclopedia Britannica, 2020).



OUR LADY OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY OF LA NAVAL DE MANILA

Feast: Second Sunday of October

The image is curently enshrined at Santo Domingo Church in Quezon Avenue, Quezon City since October 1954.
